Dear Senator Landrieu:

Cattle Producers of Louisiana joins with R-CALF USA and many other organizations, as well as the thousands of cattle producers nationwide in requesting your help to halt the ill conceived relocation of the Plum Island Animal Disease Center from Plum Island, New York to Kansas State University at Manhattan, Kansas.

Establishing the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility (NBAF), an operation which would possess and manipulate the most contagious and dangerous animal pathogens known, on the mainland at Manhattan, Kansas surrounded by thousands of cattle is an absurd effort whose time should never come.

The Department of Homeland Security's own risk assessment predicts a 70% probability of a foot and mouth disease outbreak as a result of the activities of the facility to be located at Manhattan, Kansas, a probability deemed to be too low by the GAO and the National Research Council.

It is only reasonable that citizens of the United States should be able to expect that the Department of Homeland Security would engage in activities which minimize the risk to our country. That they would proceed with this inherently unnecessary and dangerous project, with such an apparent zeal, in the face of overwhelming evidence of probable doom is Orwellian at best.

Should DHS be successful in accomplishing this relocation which could devastate the U.S. cattle industry, they should be instructed to proceed with urgent haste to develop an operational plan for the euthanasia of thousands of cattle to deal with the probable outbreak of foot and mouth disease which is predicted to result from this misguided effort.


