SENATE BILL NO. 2367 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REQUIRE LABELING OF COUNTRY OF ORIGIN ON BEEF SOLD IN MISSISSIPPI; TO PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION FOR FULLY COOKED MEAT.

MEAT INGREDIENTS IN PROCESSED FOODS AND FOR MEAT SOLD FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES; TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS

5 OF LABELING REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** (1) To the extent allowed by the Federal Meat
- 8 Inspection Act and applicable federal meat inspection regulations,
- 9 any person who sells unprocessed meat, whether fresh or frozen, in
- 10 Mississippi after January 1, 2003, shall indicate in clear and
- 11 conspicuous letters on the meat, the immediate wrapping or
- 12 container, or a sign included with the display if the meat is
- 13 displayed for sale or sold unwrapped, either the name of the
- 14 country of origin preceded by the words "product of" or the
- 15 country of origin of the meat using one (1) of the following
- 16 designations: "Imported," "American" or "Blend" of imported and
- 17 American meats.
- 18 (2) Whoever violates this section shall be subject to a
- 19 civil penalty of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for
- 20 each act of violation. Each day on which a violation occurs shall
- 21 be a separate offense. Penalties may be assessed at a hearing
- 22 held by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce.
- 23 (3) The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce
- 24 shall administer and enforce this section and shall adopt rules
- 25 and regulations necessary to carry out this section.
- 26 (4) This section shall not apply to prepared meat which is
- 27 sold at retail for consumption on the premises and meat
- 28 <u>ingredients in processed foods and</u> fully cooked meat as defined by

- 29 the United States Department of Agriculture Food Safety Inspection
- 30 Service rules and regulations.
- 31 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 32 and after July 1, 2002.
